The Strangers is about the life and dreams of Chinese working-class people in Birmingham. I have produced a photography set, a video and a booklet to tell the mentality that the participants have and visualize their struggles and reality in a surrealistic way. The juxtaposition of working hands, British natural sceneries and the music from the participants is the demonstration of my practice: how the British social environment affects the mentality of the Chinese working-class people and how their real lives went completely against their dreams because of that.






