


March Newsletter 2022

Whats been happening at the School of Art:

Foundation

One of the backbones of drawing, making and creative practice is learning to look - a much undervalued skill. With this in mind, we embedded a series of Figure Drawing sessions for our Foundation Students to familiarise ourselves with the value of taking time to look, while studying light, bone structure, muscle formation, texture, clothing, skeletal and architectural values. The learning environment became a place for thinking, sustained concentration, uninterrupted engagement, complimented by no invasive mobile phone distractions! Level 4 Fine Art G20 Work in Progress Exhibition

Performed at The Engine Room Space (2nd – 5th March) the opera follows the story of an all-female convict ship in the early 19th century, transporting prisoners to the penal colonies of Australia.









Applicant Taster Day


Wednesday Staff Talks Friday Artist Talks




Social Media Take-Over Thursdays


