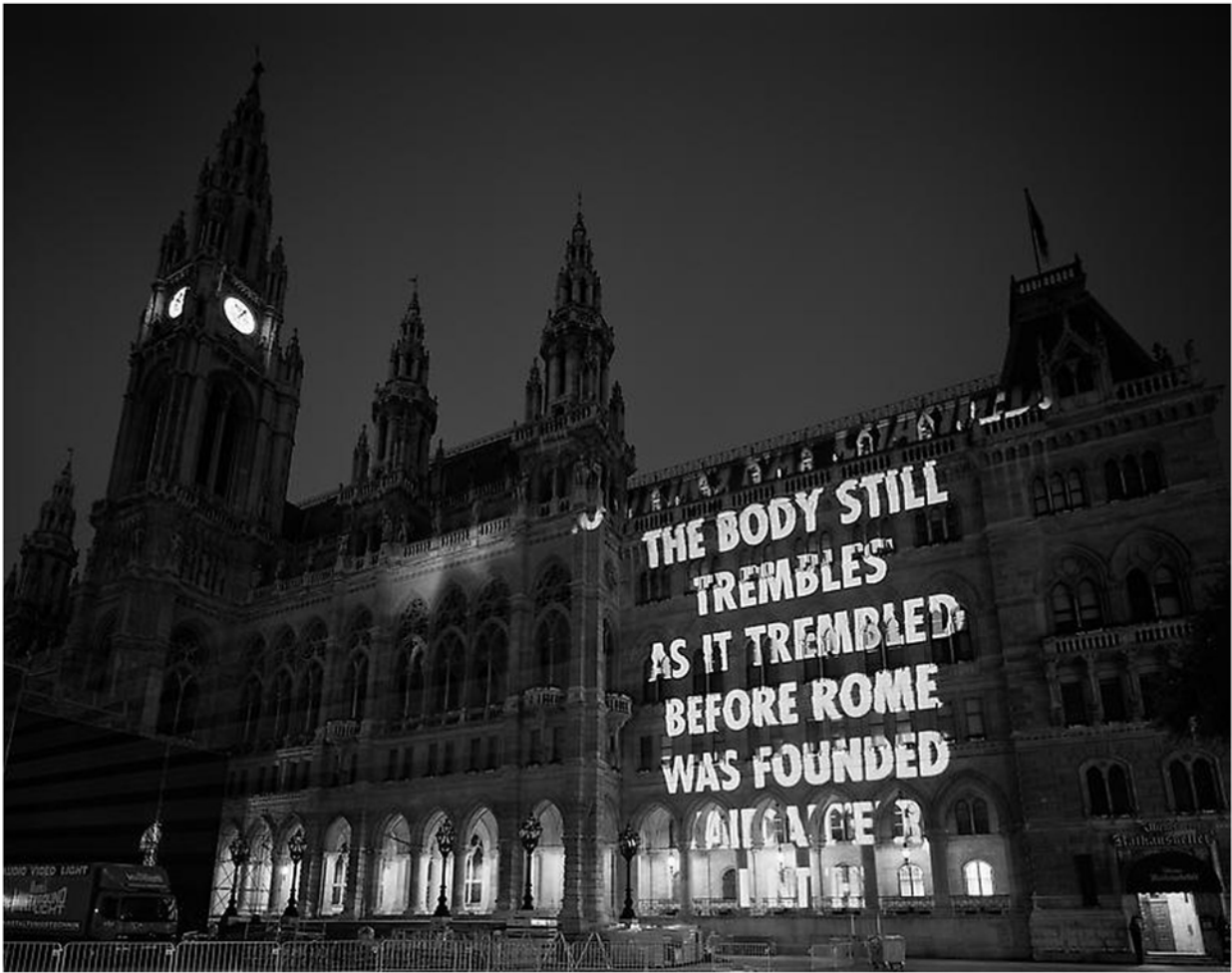

Jenny Holzer is an American Conceptual artist best known for her text-based public art projects. Exploring how language is used both as a form of communication and as a means of concealment and control, Holzer has employed a variety of media throughout her career,

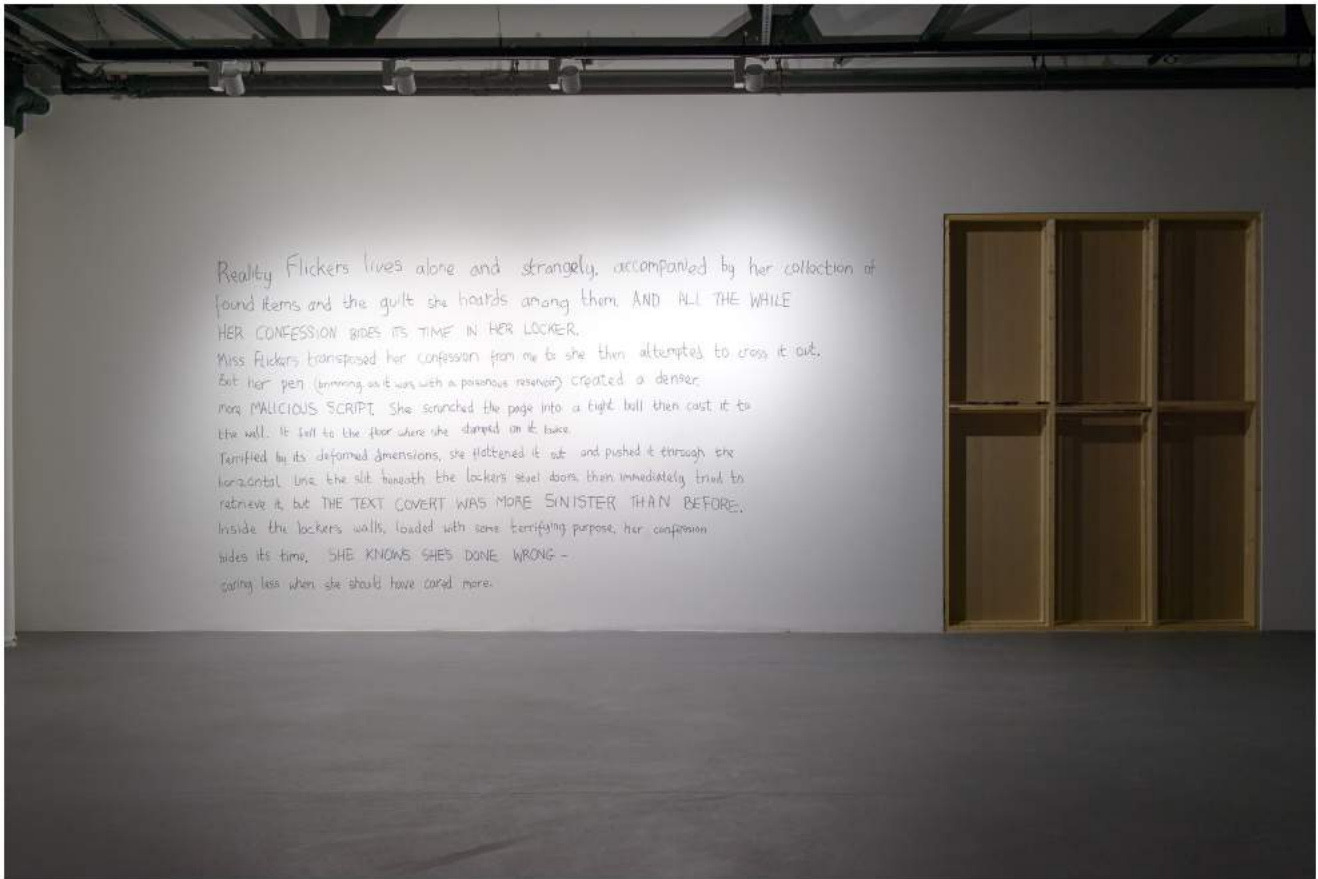

Palmer is an artist, a sculptor who builds sculptures using words. In 2013, she was one of two people (the other was film-maker Ben Rivers) whose proposals were picked as the winners of Open, a competition run by BBC Radio 4 and Artangel, the arts organisation that helps artists to stage ambitious works outside galleries. Open invited artists living and working in the UK to submit “groundbreaking site-specific proposals, bold ideas that will transform the UK’s cultural landscape”.

But then I found that I could articulate these problems, these questions, better in writing. And I also realised that in writing you can conjure objects up.
